## **Guidance For Students**



# Kaze Chikara Karate

This guidance applies to all students training at any class run by Kaze Chikara. Its purpose is to clarify responsibilities, and to give clear guidelines on our rules regarding safeguarding.

#### General

Karate begins and ends with respect, and we remind ourselves of this by bowing:

- · bow to the dojo on entering, and just before leaving;
- exchanging bows with the instructor at the start and end of the class;
- bowing to your partner before training together.

For safety reasons, if you need to leave the class for any reason, please ask first, by raising your hand. This means that the instructor can stop the class activity so that you can safely move to the exit. Similarly, if you are not in the class and want to join - if you arrive after class has already started, for example – then kneel at the side where the instructor can see you. The instructor can then invite you to join in at an appropriate time.
